#### Ingredients:

Grain Products, Processed Grain By-Products, Roughage Products (not more than 35.0%). Protein Products, Molasses Products, Animal Protein Products, Forage Products, Calcium Carbonate, Salt, Monocalcium-Dicalcium Phosphate, Ammonium Chloride, Potassium Sulfate, Magnesium Sulfate, Sodium Selenite, Cobalt Carbonate, Ferrous Sulfate, Manganese Sulfate, Manganous Oxide, Zinc Oxide, Sodium Molybdate, Zinc Sulfate, Potassium iodide, Vitamin E Supplement, Vitamin A Supplement, Vitamin D3 Supplement, Mineral Oil. Feeding Directions: Special lamb creep is designed as a free choice supplement for lambs on pasture or range grasses. Provide in self feeders from 10-20 days of age until lambs are weaned.

**IMPORTANT:** Follow these management practices

1. Lambs should be adjusted gradually to this product over a period of 5 to 7 days to reduce the risk of overeating and other digestive disturbances.
2. This ration can be self-fed to lambs if they are properly adjusted to the ration.
3. Do NOT allow starved lambs to eat this feed.
4. Vaccinate all lambs to prevent enterotoxemia (overeating disease) with both C and D toxoid.
5. Keep a constant supply of complete feed available to lambs. Do not allow material to accumulate in feeder.
6. Provide adequate bunk space for each animal. Bunks should be well protected and well managed to prevent feed from becoming wet and moldy.
7. When fed from a self-feeder, adjust feeder to minimize quantity of feed accumulating in the trough.
8. Provide free choice salt at all times.
9. Fresh; clean water should be available at all times.

**CAUTION:** Feeding undiluted or mixing errors may result in an excess lasalocid concentration which could be fatal to cattle and sheep. Do NOT allow horses or other equines access to Type A articles or Type B feeds containing lasalocid as ingestion may be fatal. Safety of lasalocid for use in unapproved species has not been established.
